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ALYN RIVER

OVERVIEW

Upper Allyn is located within the local government area of Dungog and is approximately 186kms from Sydney. It was home to the Gringai people for thousands of years. Located in the foothills of the State Forests of the Barrington Tops, Upper Allyn runs along the Allyn River and offers some stunning forest locations to visit.

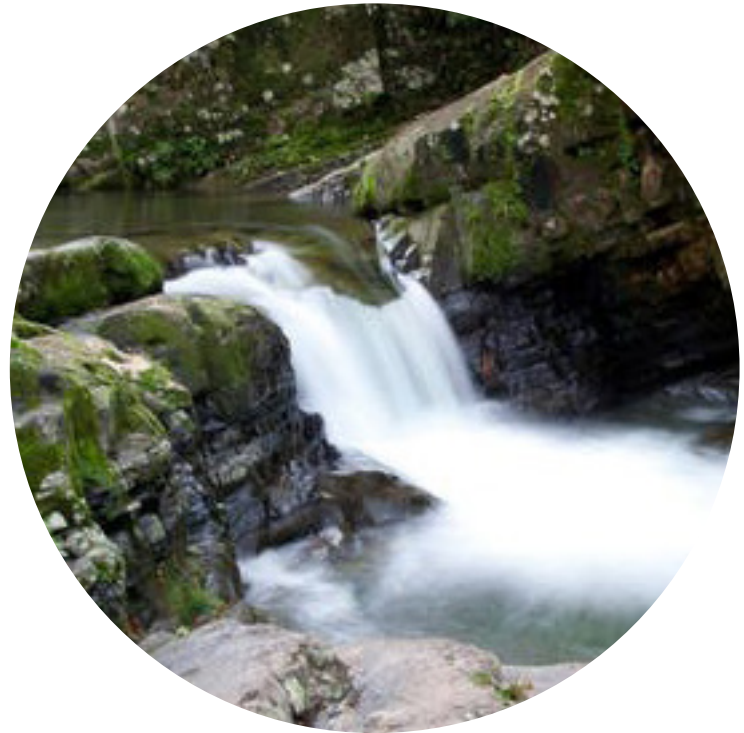

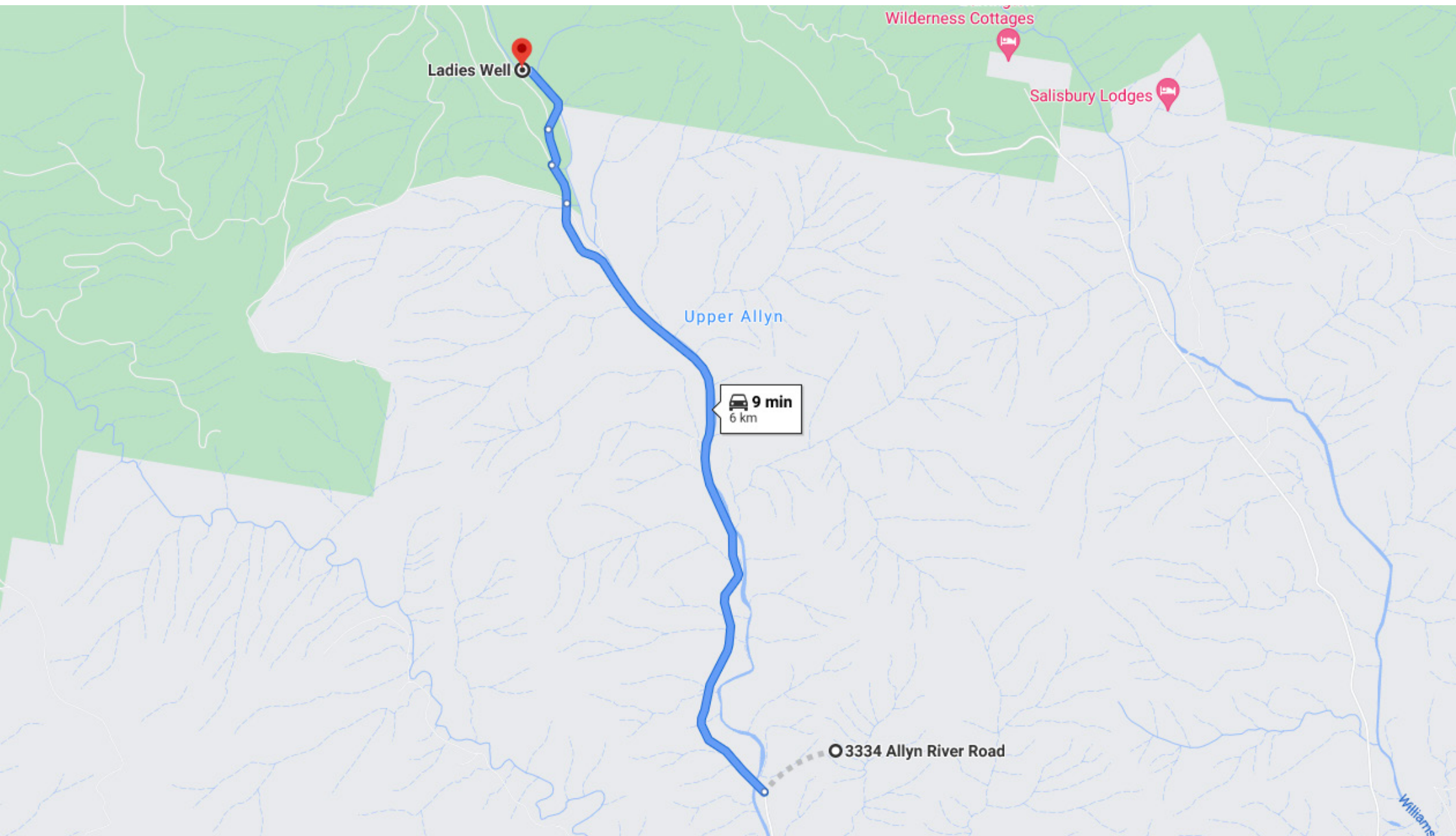
LADIES WELL

Only a 10 minute drive from our property, Ladies Well is a popular swimming hole on the Allyn River. It is located within the eastern portion of Chichester State Forest. Here you will find a variety of swimming holes with cascades and sun warmed rocks.

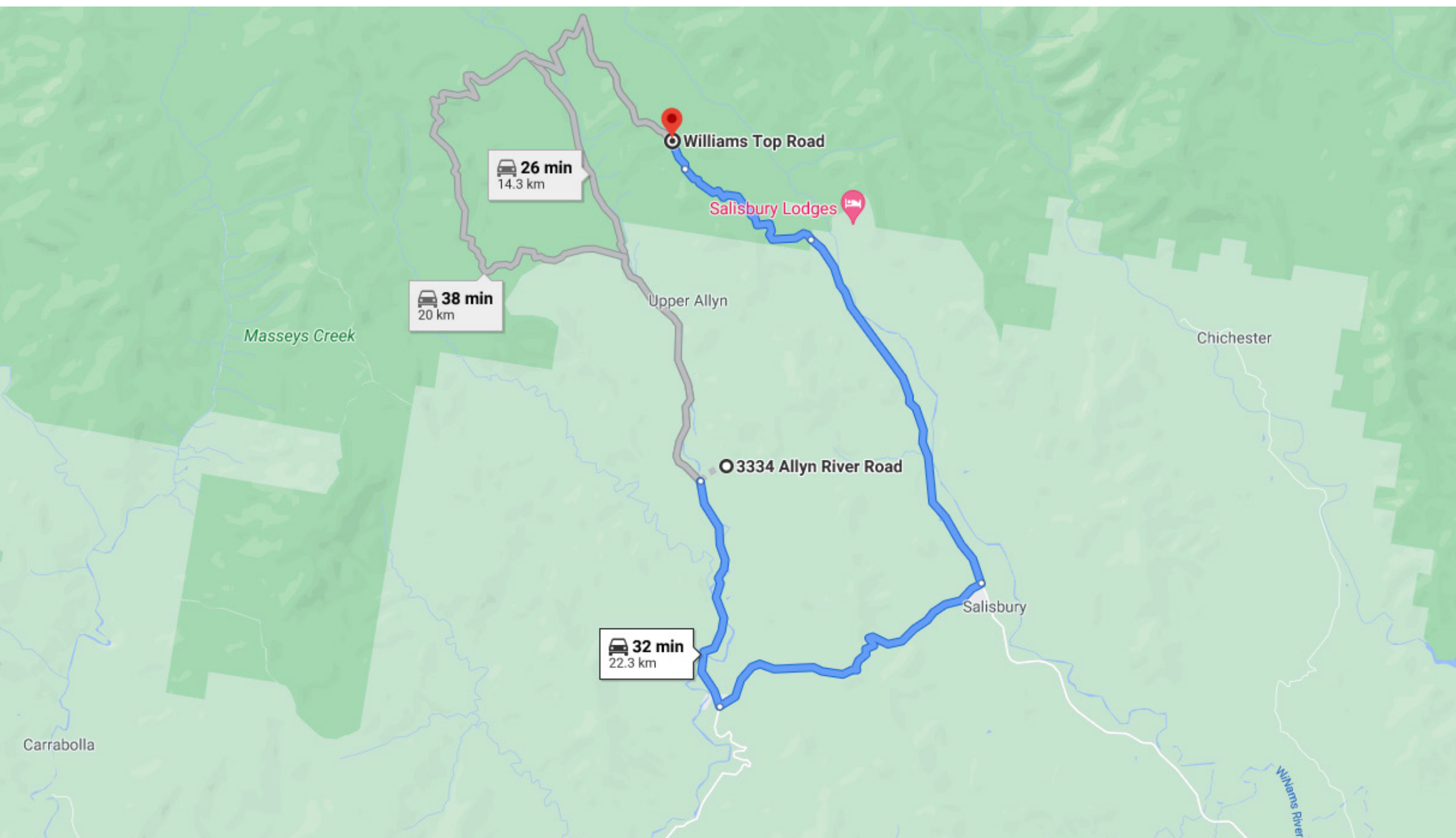


WILLIAMS TOP LOOKOUT

Experience excellent views over the mountains that span the area from the south-east to the north-west. William's river has picnic and barbecue facilities, toilets, an information board.

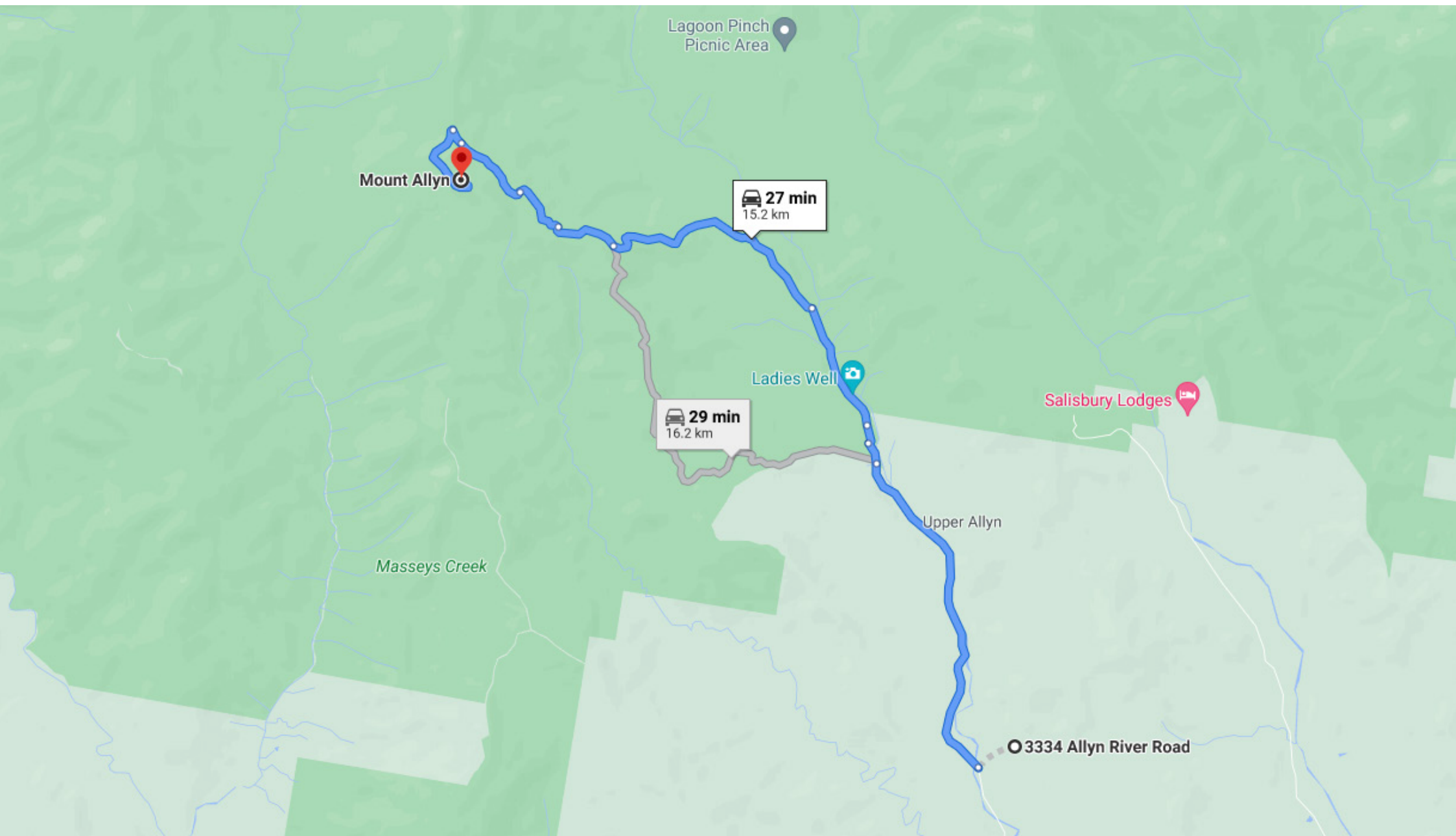


MT. ALLYN

Mount Allyn is a mountain with an elevation of 1,125 metres (3,691 ft) AHD that is part of the Allyn Range, located within the Chichester State Forest. Snow often falls in winter. Much of the mountain is covered in Antarctic Beech cool temperate rainforest. There is dirt-road access to the peak.

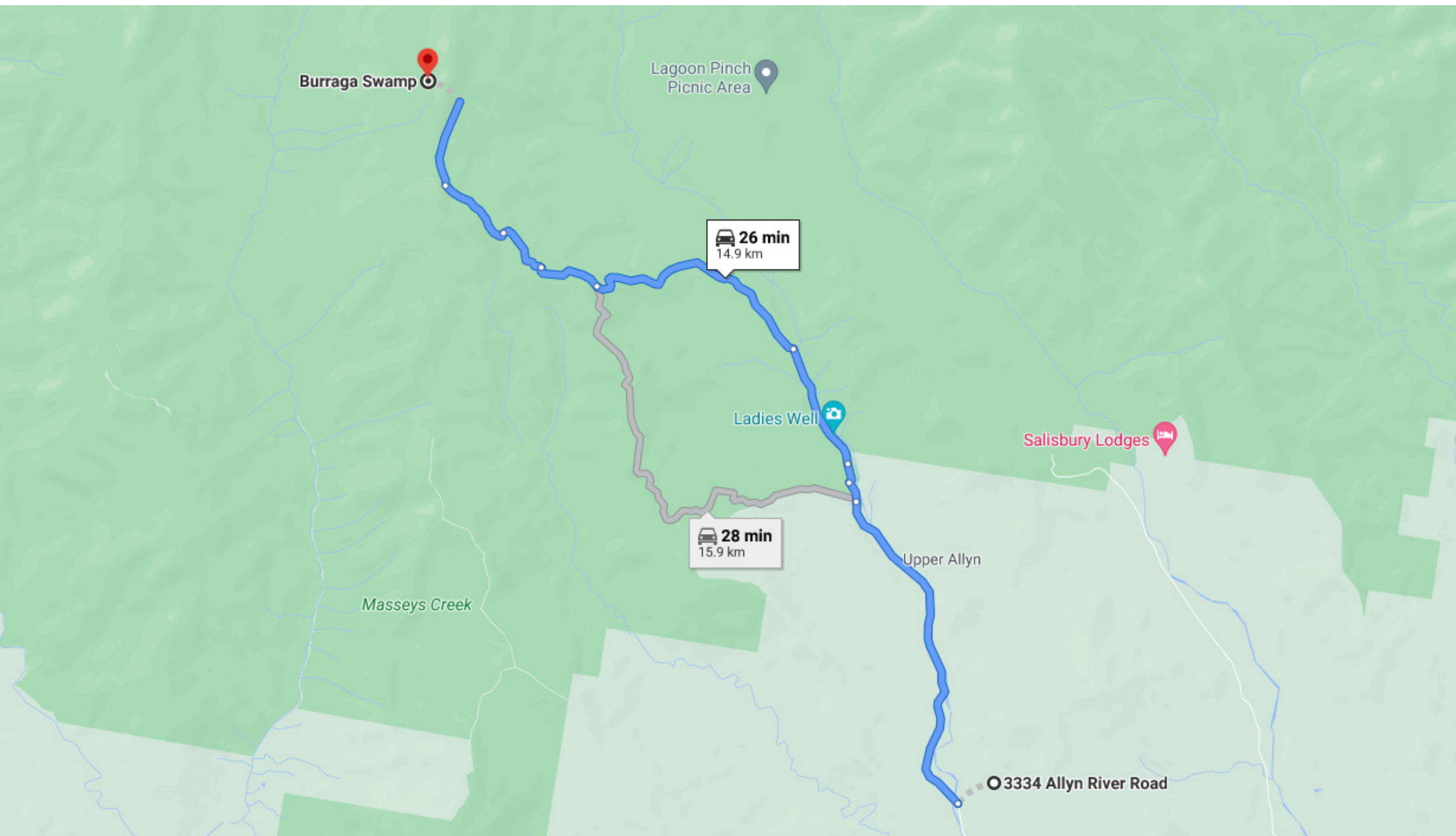


BURRAGA SWAMP

Burruga Swamp walking track is an adventurous walk where you can experience the rainforest and remote wilderness with spectacular scenic views in Barrington Tops National Park, near Chichester State Forest. The walk is 2km return with a picnic area at the entrance.

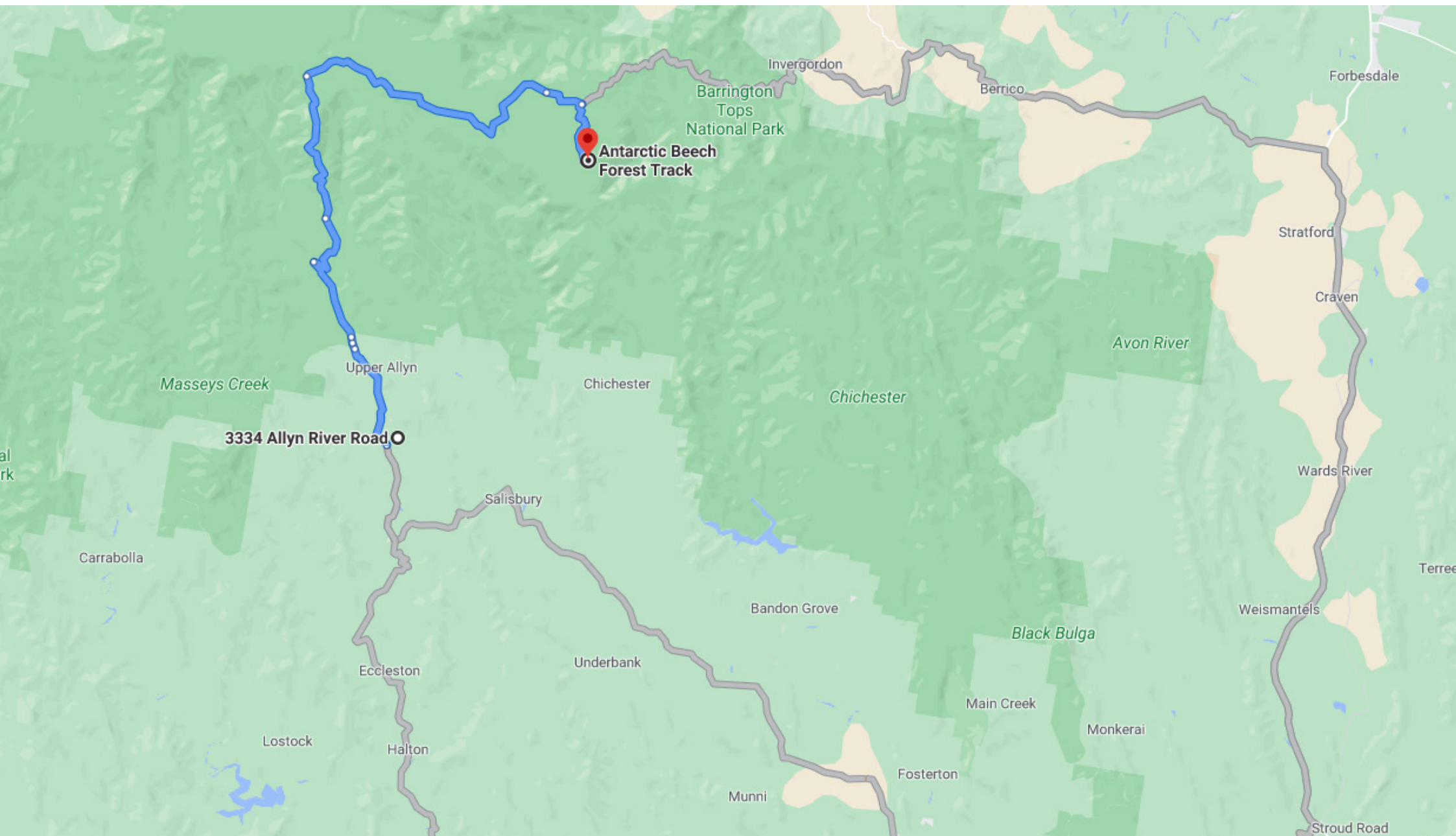


ANTARTIC BEECH FOREST

Antarctic Beech Forest walking track is a 2.5km, grade 3 circuit hike. It is part of the Glouster Tops circuit and should take around 1.5 hours to complete. Antarctic Beech features a dense canopy beech trees with vibrant moss carpets along the forest floor. Tree ferns crowd the track leading to some delightful, mossy cascades.

EAST GRESFORD

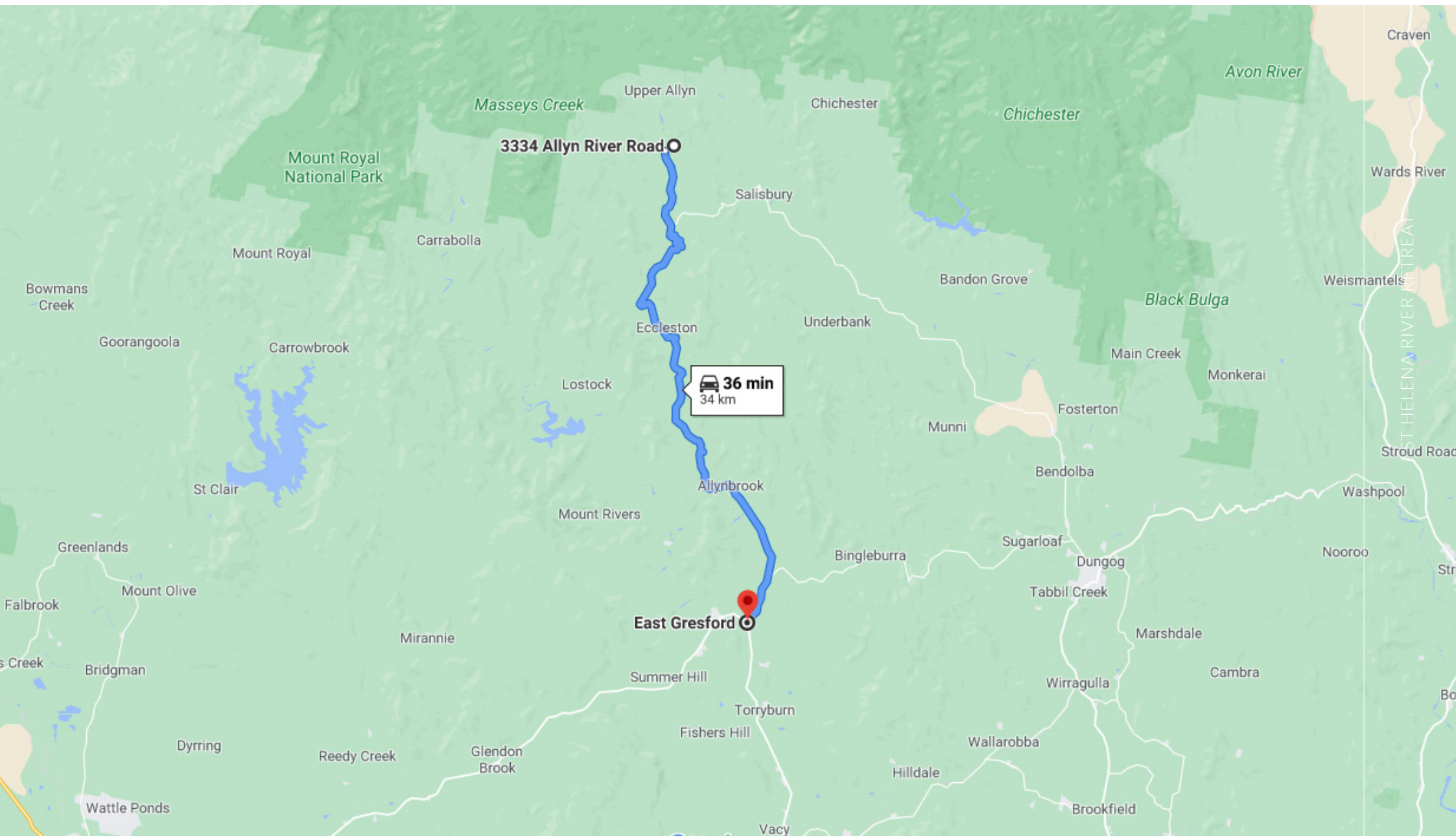
EAST GRESFORD

Gresford & East Gresford are actually two towns. separated by 2 km. They are both small rural settlements in the Upper Hunter.

Here you can find the local butcher, a petrol station, The Beatty Hotel and Foodworks. If you are coming up from the South we recommend stocking up on groceries in Maitland or in East Gresford.

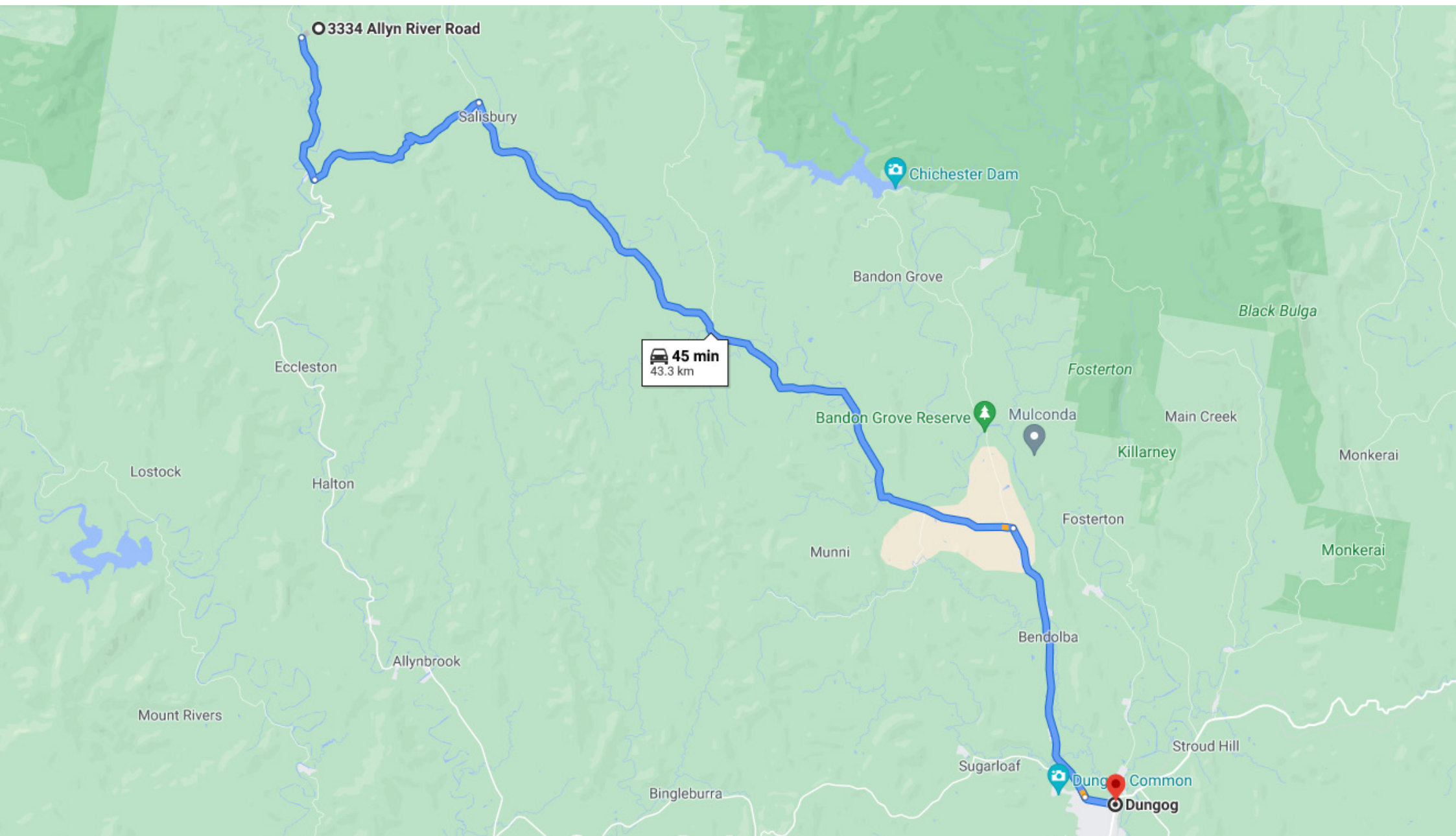
DUNGOG

Dungog is a charming and small Australian rural town. It is located in a valley surrounded by rolling hills and edged by the Williams River which flows into the Hunter River. It is approximately 214 km north of Sydney and is a great southern entry point into the Barrington Tops National Park.

Here you can find the Bank Hotel, Barrington Bakery, a few cafe's and restaurants, a service station, IGA, Jame's Theatre among other small attractions.

CLOSEST SUPERMARKET, BUTCHER & PUB

- Foodworks East Gresford
- East Gresford Pub
- Gresford meats
- You can buy alcohol in the Foodworks or at the pub
- You can also buy meat from either Foodworks or the butcher
- Foodworks closes at 6pm on Friday so if you think you will get there later we recommend going to maitland on the way in.
- Foodworks closes at 5pm Saturday and Sunday
- About a 35-45 minute drive to our property from here
- 4WD recommended to cross over the causeways

CAUSEWAYS

- There are 3 causeways that you will cross before getting to our property
- If you have booked and there is heavy rainfall or severe weather conditions predicted please contact Kerry to see if you can re-arrange your booking to another date.
